On November 16, Mabel Bianco participated as a presenter in the panel **“Latin America: Mapping political actors in sexual and reproductive rights”**, organized by CEDES and the Ford Foundation. This session presented the results of a study that consisted of an analytical map of the main actors with a regional scope doing advocacy in the field of sexual and reproductive health and rights in Latin America. The study provided experience-based strategic lessons, identified institutional development needs and provided guidance on the most promising avenues for regional cooperation. The benefits, achievements, strengths and weaknesses of sexual and reproductive health and rights networks were discussed.



On November 17, a panel was organized by GEAR, called “The UN as a Legitimate Space for Women’s Organizing: Successes and Challenges – Past and Future”, in which Mabel Bianco participated as the Latin American Focal Point for the Gender Equality Architecture Reform – GEAR- Campaign.
